





### The governance model should reflect the size and nature of the project, and there is no 'one way'



# Nous has learned valuable lessons that have changed the way we think about and implement community controlled governance.

#### INVEST TIME, BUT DON'T WAIT

Getting it right requires time investment before the project commences.

Set up governance before the project starts.

#### ESTABLISH VALUES & PRINCIPLES, BUT BE OPEN TO CHANGE

2

Genuine commitment requires embedding the right values in the organisation.

Remain open to feedback and the priorities of different groups. EMBED ABORIGINAL LEADERSHIP THROUGHOUT THE WORK

3

Aboriginal leadership is needed in programs and teams (Reference Groups are not enough).

Strike a balance of engagement.

#### DRAW ON A MIX OF SKILLS & CAPABILITIES

A mix of perspectives and expertise will be required. These need to be drawn together in a considered way.

E.g., data analysis, lived experience, Community knowledge.
